### Dear Parents and Carer's

Palm Sunday was yesterday. It was the day that marked the beginning of Holy Week. Below is some more information about Palm Sunday.

"In ancient times, palm branches symbolized goodness and victory. They were often depicted on coins and important buildings. Solomon had palm branches carved into the walls and doors of the temple (I Kings 6:29). Again at the end of the Bible, people from every nation raise palm branches to honor Jesus (Revelation 7:9).

Palm Sunday commemorates the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem (Matthew 21:1-9), when palm branches were placed in his path, before his arrest on Holy Thursday and his crucifixion on Good Friday. It thus marks the beginning of Holy Week, the final week of Lent.

In the Roman Catholic Church, as well as among many Anglican and Lutheran congregations, palm fronds (or in colder climates some kind of substitutes)

are blessed with an aspergillum outside the church building (or in cold climates in the narthex when Easter falls early in the year). A solemn procession also takes place.

In the Catholic Church, this feast now coincides with that of Passion Sunday, which is the focus of the Mass which follows the service of the blessing of palms." (from Catholic Online)

### **ANZAC 100 Year Anniversarv** Special events here in the Upper Blue Mountains



Rotary has organised a special ceremony to celebrate the 100 years of ANZAC. In July 1919 a pine tree was planted to honour the people of Leura who served in the Great War 1914 – 1918.

Mr Tom Colless said "An old gentleman by the name of Charles Dash – who was once the local mayor and had a relative, Frank Dash, that was killed at Gallipoli in August 1915 – told me that the memorial pine was planted from a cone (seedling) brought back from the battlefields of Gallipoli". This tree can still be found in Leura at the memorial location on the corner of Malvern Rd and Balmorial Rd. The 2 large sandstone pillars are at the entrance to this location. One of the pillars has the names of all the Leura soldiers. A "handshake for peace" ceremony will take place here in Leura and also in Turkey to help remember that the war is ended and our nations are at peace with each other.

At this ceremony the Turkish Council General, The BMCC Mayor and councilors, our Federal Member of Parliament and our State member will be present. There will be a band and hopefully many other people.

This day will be a historical day for the mountains. Mr. Terrance Plowright has created a sculptural plaque called "Handshake for Peace". This will be unveiled at the ceremony. Also two young pine trees will be planted near the old pine tree to continue the story for years to come.

I am asking for as many St Canice's students to attend this important event.
