

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy 2016

LETTER TO PARENTS In May 2016 the National Assessment Program –

Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained. The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 10th till

12th May 2016. A more detailed letter has been sent home to all Year 3

Ubuntu: the African Children's Choir high school graduate tour

The African Children's Choir is coming back to the Blue Mountains and Penrith in May — this time with Ubuntu, a troupe of talented high school graduates, presented by the charity Kwaya Australia.

Concerts by 10- to 12-year-olds from Uganda in 2013 and 2015 raised tens of thousands of dollars for the African Children's Choir, which funds their education until they finish university.

Since 1984, this organisation has been taking children on global concert tours, singing, drumming and dancing in huge stadiums and in school and church halls. They have performed for Queen Elizabeth II, Hillary Clinton and the late Nelson Mandela, appeared on Ellen DeGeneres' TV program, and shared the stage with Sir Paul McCartney, Annie Lennox and Will Smith.

Benefits of these tours flow both ways: the children are inspired to aim for possibilities beyond the the daily struggle to survive, and the audiences are inspired by the talent, energy, happiness and hope of performers who have grown up in extreme poverty.

The Ubuntu tour takes this concept to a new level. Having graduated from high school, 14 hard-working, highly capable 18- to 20-yearolds from Uganda and Kenya are poised to fulfil their potential and make a difference in Africa. As they prepare to enter university, they are thrilled to share with Australia how their dreams are becoming reality through this tour.



The message they bring — and the meaning of the indigenous South African word Ubuntu — is that all human beings are connected and contribute to each other's lives. This has inspired the theme of the tour, "I AM because we ARE".
