# Dear Parents and Carers

My Pilgrimage Journey

I have just returned from a recent pilgrimage with other school principals within the Diocese of Parramatta. Fr. Chris De Souza and 21 others journeyed on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November this year to go to the Holy Lands, Rome and Assisi. I didn't have any worries about the travel or the places we were to visit, but after a time in Jordan and especially Israel, I realised just how lucky we are here in Australia. We have the freedom to have our own religion and espouse the values of being a Christian. In the Holy Land, Christians are by far the minority. People asked me, "Is it a place worth visiting?" I would certainly say yes! I would recommend touring with a Pilgrimage group such as Harvest. At all times I felt safe but cautious.

Our first stop was in Jordan. We visited Mt Nebo where Moses saw the Promised Land.

There were many highlights of the pilgrimage. First it was to celebrate mass at Bethany beyond the Jordan. This was the site Jesus was baptised by John. It was a barren area, quiet and calming with the sound of birds in the bushes. The Jordan River (we would say more a large creek - 5-6m across) was where we celebrated Mass. A quiet reflection place to speak with God and ask the question "What do you want me to take from this Pilgrimage?" This is a question I am starting to grapple with now.

We travelled North across the "Allenby Bridge" into Israel, the Westbank. We waited for 2hrs at the checkpoint so that we could have a piece of paper stamped in lieu of putting a stamp in our passport. An Israeli stamp in the passport may pose difficulties in the future when travelling to some other countries.

Up to Tiberias we travelled through Jericho where we saw a sycamore tree. The next highlight was when we went to Nazareth and entered the Basilica of the Annunciation. This is where there is a traditional cave becoming the focal point of Mary's response "Let it be done unto me according to thy word". Outside of this Basilica we looked at our

Saturday Katoomba 9 am. watches and realised it was 12 noon. Every day at noon at all catholic schools in the diocese of Parramatta, the students and staff stop and say The Angelus. Here we were where the words of the Angelus made the most meaning. So we stopped under a tree and said The Angelus together. It was a very meaningful and spiritual experience.

# *The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.*

That afternoon we visited the site of the Wedding at Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle. I had actually imaged the jars used for the water / wine were large pottery ones. It is actually believed that these jars were carved from stone and measure larger than a cubic meter. A wedding in that area was celebrated by all the people in the district and may take days for invited guests to visit, not like our 4 - 5 hour ceremony and party we have nowadays.

We went to the Mount of Beatitudes where Jesus gave his message of Happiness, the Sermon on the Mount. Tabgha was the site of the multiplication of the loaves and fish and then off to the Church of the Primacy of Peter , where Jesus challenged Peter and each one of us "Do you love me?"

We had reflection time at the Sea of Galilee. The peace and tranquillity helped you stop and talk with God.

That night we were concerned that bad weather may stop us from experiencing something I was really looking forward to. But the next morning the sky had cleared and the winds calmed. We headed for a place to board a small vessel and sail out into the centre of the sea to celebrate Mass. Another experience difficult to describe other than amazing, inspirational and personally quite humbling.

Our Journey took us to Jerusalem and we stayed outside of the walls of Jerusalem near the "New Gate". We then went to the Mount of Olives - the Church of the Pater Noster (Our Father). Around these walls were tiled translations of the Our Father in all languages.

On this day it was lightly raining and our journey down the Palm Sunday Road was a slow one as it was steep and the stones were slippery and awkward. We had a 30min opportunity to visit the Garden of Gethsemane. A time to reflect on our journey to date. This is the site where Jesus spent his last night praying. There are olive trees still in this garden believed to be the very trees that Jesus walked past as He prayed that night. Inside the Church of Agony contains the stone

Inside the Church of Agony contains the stone which is believed to be upon which our Lord wept that night as He contemplated His crucification.

That afternoon we received a phone call saying that an opportunity for the next morning has opened for us, but it meant a 3:30am wake-up call. Eagerly we all agreed to this change in plan. We were privileged to celebrate mass at 5am in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. The location of Station 14 "Jesus laid in the tomb". It the ante-room, The Chapel of the was Angel. Our group celebrated mass in the same place where Jesus was prepared for burial and put into His tomb. 5am in the morning is always a quiet time, but this opportunity was even more peaceful. It was an emotional opportunity that will stay with our pilgrimage group forever. Fr. Chris used the marble stone from the tomb itself as his altar. To receive communion, we all in turn crawled into the Inner tomb, touched the piece of marble and received Jesus' body and blood. There was a sort of guiet and peace within our group as we all knew we just experienced something very special. We then journeyed in the footsteps that Jesus would have walked carrying His cross. The Stations of the Cross usually is a very busy time for pilgrimage groups as it is something everyone wants to experience, but at 6am it was guite guiet and therefore meaningful for us. I remember clearly being at the 5<sup>th</sup> Station - Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry the cross. I started to ask myself some questions: – What do I do? What can I do? How can I carry the cross for Jesus? How does Jesus carry the cross for me?

Our group went though the guarded walls of Bethlehem. With passport in hand we entered without any issues. Our goal was to visit the Church of the Nativity, the birth place of Jesus. It was extremely busy at the church. There were many pilgrims wanting to enter the church and there were a significant number of local parishioners leaving their Sunday mass. Imagine your parish church is the place where Jesus was born? After an hour of waiting we entered the Church through the Door of Humility. Down some steep stairs to the area believed to be the cave/ stable where Jesus was born. A silver star on the marble floor marks the very spot where Christ was born. The star's inscription reads in Latin "Hic de Virgine Maria Jesus Christus Natus Est", (Here of the Virgin Mary Jesus Christ was born). The centre of the star you can put your hand through and touch the actual earth.

From Israel we travelled to Rome, then Assisi and finally home. It was an experience I will remember forever. When I hear a Gospel reading I will be able to visualise the location and therefore better appreciate the words.

Thank you to the Diocese and St Canice's for supporting me in this opportunity.

#### Missing Guided Readers

One of the methods we use to teach your child to read is by using **GUIDED READERS**. In a group of 4 or 5, each student has the same text. The teacher listens to each one read each day, and teaches the skills & strategies using a shared text.

Losing 50 guided Readers means that there is now 43 SETS OF GUIDED READERS with less than 4/5 books, which then reduces the number of resources we have to teach at that level.

The cost of each book is \$12 and they have to be purchased in sets of 6! We send these books home on trust, unlike Library books which go out on the student's name.

We take our job of teaching reading seriously and value each book we have purchased. A replacement of these 50 books (if we could just replace the one) would total \$600. We just don't have that much money each year just to replace what we have and not buy new books for our Library.
