Growth through love and learning

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Dear Parents and Carers

Yesterday's Gospel reading was a very interesting one. It was the story of Jesus healing the blind man, Bartimaeus (Mark 10: 46-52). "Go your faith has saved you". What makes this reading so interesting is the connection with previous Sunday readings when Jesus asked James and John "What do you want of me?". Their reply was to ask for a seat on the right and left of God. Jesus also said to his disciples to let the children come to him. But to Bartimaeus Jesus, cures him and invites him to join him on his journey. Our challenge is to throw away our cloak of protection and security and follow Jesus. He challenges us to be like children and follow him. Jesus asks us not to be selfish or greedy but follow him.

I was privileged to be asked to speak after mass at a function for a teacher who was retiring at the end of this year. Mrs. Helen Minol has taught at Our Lady of the Rosary St Marys for 51 years. She has given her life to the school and to the students she taught. What an inspiration, what dedication, what an example of throwing away one's coat to follow Jesus. With more than 300 people gathered at this occasion, I was in awe of the expressions of gratitude poured onto Helen. I told a story of Helen's first day teaching kindergarten in 1965. She asked the Sister in charge what she should do with the 102 little kinders looking up at her. Sister's reply was "You have 102 students this morning, make sure you have 102 this afternoon". And that is exactly what she did. She cared and nurtured each and every child in her care for the past 51 years. By helping and working to help others we are following the call of Jesus.

Late Arrivals

Children arriving after the school bell need to be escorted by a parent or carer to the front Office to sign in. This is a child protection issue as we need to be sure that parents are aware of where their children are at all times. Children may arrive at school from 8.20am when staff are on duty. When a child arrives late they cause disruption to the whole class, they miss assembly and morning instructions but more importantly they miss part of their first lesson which in most cases is Literacy. Punctuality is a valuable life skill, please discuss and encourage this with your children.

Afternoon Dismissal

If your child is being picked up from school by another parent, friend or relative, a written note must be submitted to the Office prior to the date.

Whooping Cough

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children. Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.

- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.

Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades with time. Check that all your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years and 12 years of age (offered to all Year 7 students through the NSW school-based vaccination program). A booster is also recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.
