Today all Years 2 – 6 start school

Kindergarten and Year I start on Wednesday.

During the next 2 days each of the Kindergarten and Year I students will be visiting the school for their Mathematical Assessment Interview (MAI) with the class teacher. Every other student in the school will also be assessed with the MAI, but this will be carried out during school time over the next 3-4 weeks. This data we gather, will inform us regarding the level of achievement of your child in the domains of Counting, Place Value, Addition/ Subtraction and Multiplication/ Division. This data will be used to determine what learning plan is required for your child.

Assessments

A number of times throughout the term the teachers will be assessing your child's achievement level in many things especially in Reading, Writing, Problem Solving Skills and their understanding of the Sacraments and Scripture. All of this data is compiled in our Data Room. This gives us a clear picture of the individual achievement of each student as well as the class achievement and whole school achievement. This data helps us plan individually, as a class and as a school.

Attendance Data

Another piece of data we will be tracking for each student will be their attendance rate at school. I will explain more about this over the coming newsletters, but basically we are aiming towards better school attendance rates than we have achieved in the past. In 2016 the St Canice's' overall attendance rate was a very low 75%.

This means that if every student were at school every day for the whole of the 2016 school year, we would have achieved 100%. But St Canice's could only achieve attendance 75% of the time. The Diocesan mantra is "Every Day, Every Child". What can we do about this statistic for our school? Our goal is to significantly improve this figure. School is essential for every student every single day from the beginning of the day to the very end of the day.

Attached is a letter from the school about a new initiative relating to our S@S and the many curriculum areas. Have a read it is a great initiative and worth the time and effort from each of us. Your support would be greatly appreciated.

Dear Parents and Carers of St Canice's students,

This term all students will make their own re-useable beeswax food wrap. We believe that making these will be beneficial to our local environment and supports the concepts we will explore during our Term 2 S@S (Sculpture at School)

including:-



Reusable food wrap is a more sustainable option.

It can be washed and reused many times, creating less waste.

It's healthier for you to wrap your food in this beeswax fabric rather than having plastic wrapped around your food.

You'll save money if you use reusable food wrap instead of purchasing commercial food wrap.

Kinder and Yr 1 students will be assisted by their buddies to create their food wrap. The school will provide the beeswax, material and buttons (if children choose to add them). The wrap works perfectly well without buttons. The wrap needs to be cleared of excess food each day. It can be rinsed in luke-warm water to clean.

Each child is asked to donate \$2 towards the cost of the wrap. Please send this in to the office in an envelope with your Child's Name; Food Wrap & Class clearly labelled.

We have elected to make a wrap that would accommodate a sandwich. Please feel free to extend this at home and make smaller / larger wraps for your individual needs. It's a quick, easy craft activity to complete with your child and it opens the conversation for Science and Environmental Care conversations.
