Notice of Roadworks in Katoomba Street





Athletics Carnival 2017

Dear Parents & Carers,

On Friday, 26th May (Week 5) all children will participate in the School Athletics Carnival which will be held at Pitt Park, Wentworth Falls. In case of poor weather the backup day is Friday 2nd June (Week 6).

This will also be the selection trial for the Athletics Team, which will represent the school at the Nepean Zone Athletics Carnival in Term 3,

Transport - Bus	Start Time: Finish Time:	8:35am children need to be at school on time. 2:50pm bus will return to school in time for normal dismissal

Requirements:

- wear suitable sport clothes in house colours or school sport uniform
- bring warm clothes and wet weather gear etc.
- bring healthy snacks, lunch and plenty of water to drink
- label all clothing and possessions
- wear a sun protective hat throughout the day
- supply own sunscreen and reapply during the day
- bring asthma puffer if asthmatic (or any other medications)
- go to class teacher on arrival and before leaving to be signed in and out.

Format for the day:

- Students will be with their age group and rotate around events including 100 metre sprint, long jump, relays, and novelty events
- Children who finish 1st, 2^{ed}, 3^{ed} in 100 metre, 200 metre, 800 metre and long jump will receive respective ribbons.
- Medals will be presented to a boy and a girl from each age group (junior, 11yr and senior) who
 achieves the highest overall points tally at the carnival. These will be presented in the days soon after
 the carnival.

In order to run the athletics carnival, we require adults to help with various roles such as

- Timekeepers
- Marshals, Event Assistants
- helping to set up and pack up.
- transporting tents and other items to Pitt Park (a ute or trailer would be useful)

2. In branch

Visit a Commonwealth Bank branch with identification for yourself and your child, like a driver's licence and birth certificate.

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit in every week on School Banking day using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.

School Banking day is Tuesday. Each week you need to hand your yellow wallet to your teacher.

Fact sheet: The School Opal card

Who's eligible?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students need to be N5W residents and may need to live a minimum distance away from their school:

- Years K-2 (Infants) there's no minimum distance.
- Years 3-6 (Primary) 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking or further.
- Years 7-12 (Secondary) 2.0km straight line distance or 2.9km walking or further.

Students completing secondary studies at TAFE, boarding school students and students temporarily in Australia may also be eligible for a School Opal card. The eligibility criteria for these students is available at **transportnsw.info/school-students**.

A School Opel card is provided to eligible students who need to travel within the Opel network. Paper travel passes are issued to eligible students who need to travel outside the Opel network.

Who needs to apply?

Most students or parents won't need to apply for the School Opal card. The School Opal card will be sent to a student's school automatically at the beginning of the new school year in 2016.

However, a new application is required if:

- The student is just starting school or has not had a pass for travel before.
- The student is progressing from Year 2 to 3, or Year 6 to 7.
- The student is changing schools, including going between primary and secondary school.
- The student's personal details have changed (e.g. address).

Applications must be made by a parent or guardian for children aged 15 years and under. Applications must be made by fire student if aged 16 years or older.

How to apply

Step 1 Complete the application at transportnsw.info/school-students.

Step 2 Print, sign and submit the form to the school for endorsoment.

Step 3 The school will then forware the application to Transport for NSW for processing. Once approved, Transport for NSW sends the School Opal card to the home address given in the application.

The application may take several weeks and the applicant's email address is required.

If the student doesn't qualify for free travel

They may be eligible for a Term Bus Pass which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.
